Use this guide to aid in your discussions with your treating physician or specialist. Talk with your healthcare provider to determine the best treatment option for your heart condition.

Are there any alternative therapies I should try or consider?	Are there different types of ablation procedures?
Consider:	Can you describe radiofrequency ablation?
What are the long-term effects of my condition?	Can you describe cryoablation?
What caused my atrial fibrillation?	Is one type of ablation more effective than the other?
Is my condition treatable?	Have you performed ablation procedures to treat atrial fibrillation? If so, how many?
What will my insurance cover?	Am I a good candidate for an ablation procedure?
What other specialists should I be referred to?	What is the procedure intended to do?
How often should I follow up with you?	What happens during the procedure?
What symptoms should I be concerned about?	After the procedure, will I have to stay overnight in the hospital?
Will I need to take any medications?	What are the outcomes for these kinds of procedures?
How at risk am I for stroke? Is there anything I can do to decrease my risk?	Can I choose the type of procedure I think is best for me?
Are there lifestyle changes I should make?	If I choose not to proceed with an ablation procedure, will my Afib disease progress?
